Purpose: To keep participants out of the criminal justice system by providing them with the skills and opportunities necessary to achieve stable employment.

Desired outcomes: First time felony drug sales offenders will have an opportunity to gain or return to employment, education, and training, and removal of their felony charge upon completion of the program.

Key components: The Back On Track program is a partnership with the San

Francisco District Attorney's Office and the Family Services Agency to provide intensive case management to individuals that have been arrested for a first time drug sales felony case. The deferred entry of judgment (DEJ) is an entered guilty plea which is used as an accountability tool. Goodwill provides job readiness workshops, case management, career advising, life skills workshops, and job, training, and education placement. Family Services Agency provides mental health, and peer support services. Services are provided for about one year.
